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Keeping Members Engaged During Winter & Stock Show Season

Winter months and stock show season in Texas can challenge attendance at 4-H club meetings. However, with intentional planning, you can maintain strong engagement and ensure members continue showing up. Here are tangible solutions to help club managers navigate this busy time.

- 1. Make Meetings Worth Attending
- Offer Valuable Content: Plan meetings with engaging activities like hands-on workshops, project demonstrations, or guest speakers relevant to stock show interests, such as livestock judges or veterinarians.
- Highlight Opportunities: Use meetings to share updates on competitions, scholarships, or upcoming stock show deadlines, ensuring members see the value in attending.
- 2. Be Flexible with Scheduling
 - Avoid Conflicts: Adjust meeting dates or times to avoid overlapping with major stock shows or winter school activities. A poll can help determine the best time for members and families.
 - Hybrid Options: Offer a virtual meeting option for members traveling or juggling tight schedules, ensuring everyone stays informed even if they can't attend in person.
- 3. Foster Community and Fun
 - Celebrate Successes: Recognize members' achievements at recent stock shows or winter events during meetings. Public acknowledgment builds excitement and camaraderie.
 - Incorporate Fun Themes: Create seasonal themes or fun challenges like a winter potluck, costume contest, or stock show trivia night to keep meetings enjoyable.
- 4. Communicate Clearly and Consistently
 - Use Multiple Channels: Share meeting reminders through email, social media, and text messages, emphasizing the importance of staying connected.
 - Highlight What's New: Include specific details about why members won't want to miss the meeting, like unique activities or essential updates.
- 5. Engage Families and Leaders
 - Delegate Roles: Assign responsibilities to members and parents, such as leading an activity, organizing snacks, or sharing a project update. Involvement boosts commitment.
 - Encourage Peer Connection: Pair experienced members with newer ones to foster mentorship and make meetings more inclusive and engaging.




